

#### Other tips:

Connect the water cycle to your community's current season and events and to what students can see. Ask students questions (in Kriol preferably) like:

- What part of the water cycle are we in today? / Weya wi la dis woda saikul tudei?
- Where did water from the last rain go? Las taim imin rein, weya det woda bin gu? (Was it run-off or infiltration? / Imin ranof o Infiltreishin?)
- What is a cloud? / Wani klaud?
- What happens to water after it condenses in a cloud? (Students will
  often say it rains but help them think about how clouds don't always
  result in precipitation) / Wani hepen afta woda majurrumap mijel la
  klaud?
