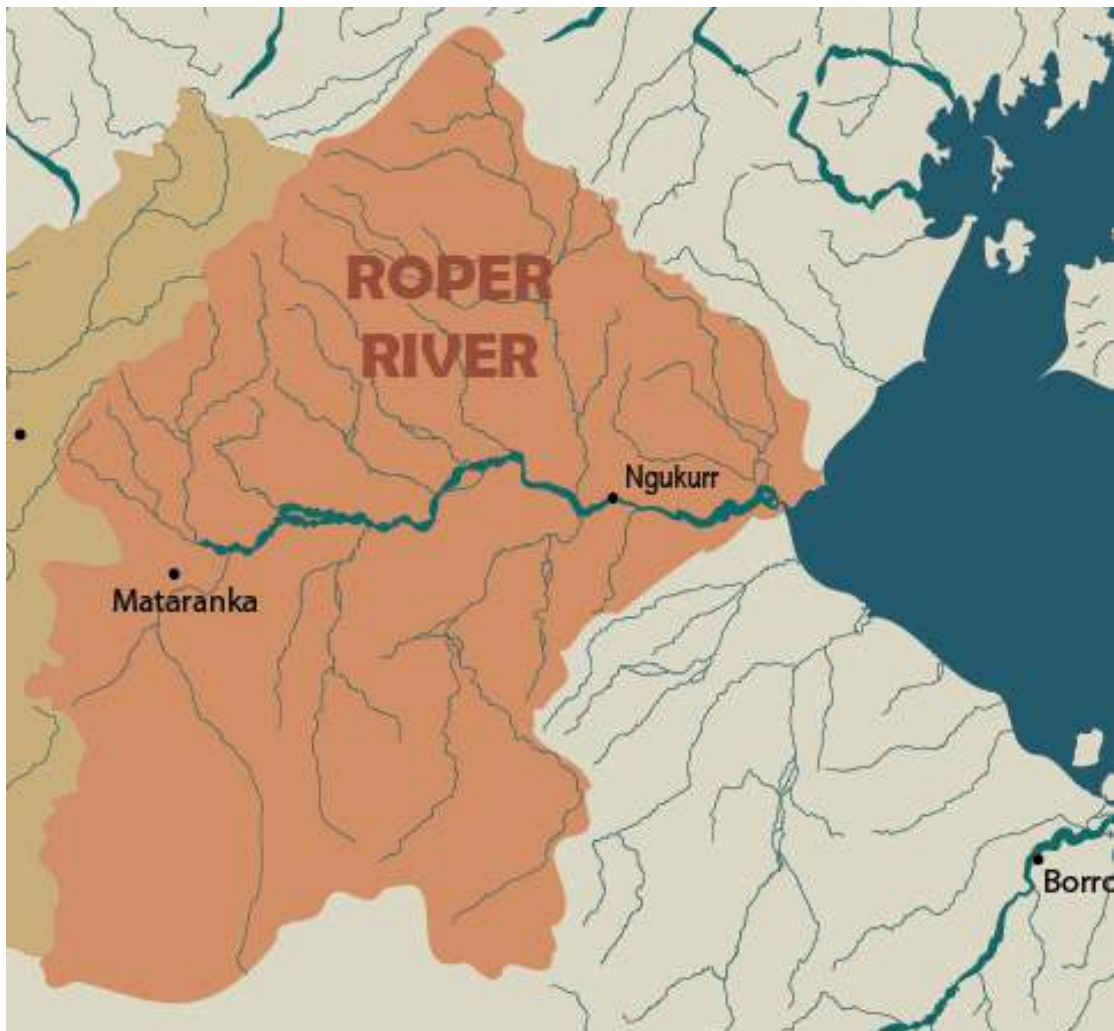


# Ropa Riba eriya

## *Teacher's notes*

### **Translation of Kriol instruction:**

What are the water places you know of in our area? It could be rivers, billabongs, springs.

### **Discussion tips:**

Introduce the idea of a river catchment

- What is the orange shaded area? What happens on either side of the boundary/line? / Wotfo dei bin pudum orinj kala la det eriya? Wotfo det lain?
- Explain what happens to rain that falls on country in the orange area and what happens to water/rain that fall on country outside the orange area. Link it to the water cycle
- For the Geography unit, "water in the world", this is a good talking point for talking about water uses - what happens to all the water in this catchment area? What are the different ways it gets used? (People/community, agriculture, nature (keep country healthy), mining, roads etc.)
